Black Lives Matter - They Always Have Mattered

Each New Year's Day, as our ancestors had done, in the homes of many African Americans, there is a traditional meal of meat, greens, and blackeyed peas and rice. The greens are for prosperity and the black eyed peas and rice is for good luck. No one, however, but God, could foresee the seismic shift that would take place in the first five months of 2020. The shift would greatly affect one's health and wealth. Interesting enough, the 2020 theme given to Rev. Paul by God for Mt. Zion was, "A Season of Shift." And what a shift it has been.

In January, Trump's impeachment trial began. In February, news broadcasters briefly shared sound bites about a contagious illness that many people in China had contracted. Without much publicity, three white men murdered a 25-year old black jogger, Ahmaud Arbery. In March, the disease is identified as COVID-19. Cases in the U.S. surpass that of China and Italy. In April. Bernie Sanders suspends his candidacy for President. In Louisville, Kentucky, local news outlets report the death of a black woman named Breoona Taylor, who was killed by police as she slept in bed. In May, a 17-year-old girl uses her cell phone to film the murder of George Floyd, another African American man who would die at the hands of police. His death, however, was like none other. It sparked the largest global social justice protests in support of Blacks Lives Matter that the world has ever seen. Five months into 2020... the world has made a seismic shift.

So what is Black Lives Matter, the organization that has been labeled as the largest 21st century civil rights organization to a terrorist group? Why has this slogan been taken from America, to England, to Australia, to India and beyond? And why is it important for you to know about it?

Black Lives Matter was co-founded in 2013 by three women: Patrisse Khan-Cullars, Alicia Garza and Opal Tometi. They decided such an organization was needed following the shocking murder of Travon Martin, an innocent 17-year old high school student and the acquittal of his murderer, George Zimmerman. Its goal is to "expose institutional systems of violence targeted against African American populations."

"Garza is an Oakland, California based writer, organizer and freedom dreamer who is currently the Special Projects Director for the National Domestic Workers Alliance, the nation's leading voice for domestic workers." "Tometi is a Nigerian-American writer, strategist and organizer residing in New York City. She is currently at the helm of the country's leading Black organization for immigrant rights, the Black Alliance for Just Immigration (BAJI). Founded in 2006, BAJI is a national organization that educates and advocates to further immigrant rights and racial justice together with African-American, Afro-Latino, African, and Caribbean immigrant communities."

"Black Lives Matter started from a post that I put on Facebook after the acquittal of George Zimmerman. I woke up in the middle of the night sobbing, just trying to process what had happened and wanting to find community around being in a lot of grief and having a lot of rage."

As is typically done when African Americans make the decision to take control of the narrative of their lives, those in opposition denounced the group by dismissing the organization and latching on to phrases such as "All lives Matter" and/or "Blue Lives Matter." Trump has tweeted that it is a racist organization and now a hate group.

On May 25, #BlackLivesMatter took a different and dramatic turn. The death of George Floyd was the "straw that literally broke the camel's back." Enough was enough. Now white people were outraged. In 8 minutes and 46 seconds, they watched a man die because he allegedly used a counterfeit \$20 bill in a

corner geocery store. How and why did this heineous act take place — AGAIN??? People around the world now began to understand why Colin Kaepernick took a knee. It wasn't about disgracing the American flag as so called patriotic Americans believed. Kaepernick's simple, nonviolent protest of kneeling during the National Anthem signified his protest to police brutality against black people. This is what he always tried to get others to understand. It finally hit home to people.

"I am not going to stand up to show pride in a flag for a country that oppresses black people and people of color. To me, this is bigger than football and it would be selfish on my part to look the other way. There are bodies in the street and people getting paid leave and getting away with murder."

On June 5 after a continual dispute with Trump concerning who owned the streets of Washington, D.C., Mayor Muriel Bowser had a section of 16th street that leads straight to the White House named, Black Lives Matter Plaza. This action has spawn cities across the nation and the world to paint Black Lives Matter on streets.

Mt. Zion's Virtual Coffee Hour



ISSUE ONE-PAGER: RACIAL JUSTICE

The UCC on Racial Justice:

- The United Church of Christ remains correlated to being an anti-racist church and supports equal access for communities of color to vote without restrictions
- During General Synod 23 an addendum was added to 1993 Pronouncement calling the UCC to become a Multiracial, Multicaltural Church. The addendum called the UCC to also become an "Anti-Racise" denomination. In doing so, we encourage all Conferences and Associations and local churches of the UCC so adopt anti-racism mandates, including policy that encourages anti-racism programs for all UCC staff and volunteers.
- When a church claims boldly "Black Lives Mazzer" at this moment, it chooses to show up
 intentionally against all given societal values of supremacy and superiority or common-sense
 complicency. By insisting on the intrinsic worth of all human beings, Jesus models for us how God
 loves justly, and how his disciples can love publicly in a world of inequality. We live out the love of
 God justly by publicly saying #BlackLivesMaster.




