MT. ZION CELEBRATES 161ST ANNIVERSARY WITH ART REVEAL

































On Sunday, September 14, Mt. Zion celebrated 161 years of ministry and service to the greater Cleveland community. Mt. Zion is the third oldest historically African American Christian congregation in the City of Cleveland and the first United Church of Christ congregation started for and by African Americans in the state of Ohio. It has had a rich history, including being in six different locations across the east side of Cleveland and being served by twenty-four pastors.

Mt. Zion's rich history of service includes helping to settle formerly enslaved persons in the City of Cleveland, providing childcare for working mothers, supporting economic development for small businesses, and doing job training and workforce development.

This year, as we gathered for our 161st Anniversary

celebration, we were blessed to hold our Annual Commitment Walk led by the Board of Christian Stewardship. Thank you to the many members who came forward with their commitment cards and shared a scripture reading with fellow worshippers.

The highlight of our anniversary celebration was the unveiling of a new glass art installation in the narthex, designed and orchestrated by glass artist Andrea Johnson, daughter of Mt. Zion member, Gwen Johnson. It includes four large panels depicting "Welcome and Inclusion," hallmarks of Mt. Zion's ministry. This beautiful glass work of art will be a blessing for Mt. Zion members and visitors for many years to come," said Rev. Paul following the unveiling.

Board of Mission & Outreach Hosts Mission and Ministry Fair

The Board of Mission & Outreach held its annual Mission and Ministry Fair on September 21. Under the leadership of Lauretha Brown Malone, the board had been planning the event for the past seven months. Mt. Zion members were invited to the Rozell Threat Social Hall to meet and talk with the leaders of each ministry and organization.

In addition to the many ministries at Mt. Zion, members generously give donations through the Mission Fund to assist outside organizations. The 2025 recipients were The Teen Kingz, an intergenerational program for toddlers, teens, and adults; the United Protestant Campus Ministry (UPCAM), which is located on Case University's campus and assists Case students; the Living Water Association of the United Church of Christ, our denominational association; Nehemiah Spencer and the Reflections Dance Theatre, and the Sickle Cell Anemia Foundation.

During the worship service, members and visitors were able to

see videos produced by the organizations, which shared information about their work to serve others. While engaging with representatives of Mt. Zion's ministries, members and visitors had the opportunity to learn about each ministry and sign up to work with and/or join it.

Like last year, members and visitors received a lovely gift bag that included the Mt. Zion brochure, a program listing each ministry and organization, a gift pad with a pen, candy, and other useful items. All who attended were asked to visit the tables to receive a sticker. Those with three or more stickers were invited to enjoy a delicious meal consisting of chicken wings, fruit, cheese, crackers, and a beverage.


Neighbors in Need is a Special Mission

We are thankful for the generosity you have shown in the past and look forward to your support this year.


