

On the Road to a New Reality

As we embark on the month of May in the midst of the unprecedented circumstances of our lives, we give God thanks and praise for all of the blessings that God has provided. God's presence and God's power have enabled us to be sustained -- in spite of our circumstances. This is something for which we must be grateful. Perhaps, many are asking the question, when will we join together again, as a family for worship? I have prayed about that and sought guidance from the Lord. At this time, I believe we should focus our sights on joining for public worship again on May 31, Pentecost Sunday, if the Lord is willing. Though some businesses are planning to open as soon as the first weekend in May, I believe it would be ill advised and irresponsible for us to do so. This is because of the increasing numbers of infections in Cuyahoga county, the fact that mass testing has not taken place and the absence of a tested vaccine. Quite frankly, as I have prayed, I have been strongly led to stand still at this time. When this began, God told me to continue broadcasting via Facebook Live from our pulpit until it was safe to do otherwise. I am trusting God and divine wisdom to lead us to make right decisions in this regard.

For the next four Sundays, I will preach a sermon series entitled, "Preparing for Pentecost." This series will guide us through the first chapter of the Book of Acts and by May 31, it will bring us to the power of the Pentecost experience found in Acts chapter 2. This was when the Holy

Spirit fell upon the believers in Jerusalem and gave birth to the church of Jesus with the conversion of more than 3,000 believers. The Pentecost experience teaches us the virtue of trusting in the promises of God. It confirms in us, the benefits of seeking God's indwelling presence. The gifts and the power of the Holy Spirit are for us, just as they were for the first century believers. It is up to us to seek the gifts as the Apostle Paul taught us in 1 Corinthians 13:31 where he writes these words, "But strive for the greater gifts. And I will show you a still more excellent way."

I believe, if we all utilize this season to seek Christ, we will be better off, when we come out of this time of exile. We will be stronger. We will be better. We will be more faith-filled and more determined to do the work of the One who sent us.

In this season of uncertainty, the Body of Christ is called to serve as never before. We are called to bring hope, where there is hopelessness. We are anointed to bring light, where the dark clouds have shaded the sun from view. We are called to weep with those who weep and to rejoice with those who rejoice. We are chosen to bring the message of a risen savior and an empty tomb to a people in desperate need of resurrection. Our hope is not built on the things we have or the jobs we do or the titles we wear. Our hope is built on the solid rock that cannot fail...Jesus Christ.

In this time, my prayer for each of you is that you would see in every situation and in every circumstance, the amazing hand of God. I pray that you would come to know his healing and his sustaining and that you would be affirmed by his guiding and directing. I implore all who are able, to stay at home and to stay safe and well. If you must go out, wear a mask and gloves. Wash your hands often and take care of yourself. I am praying fervently for each of you. With God's help we will get through this.

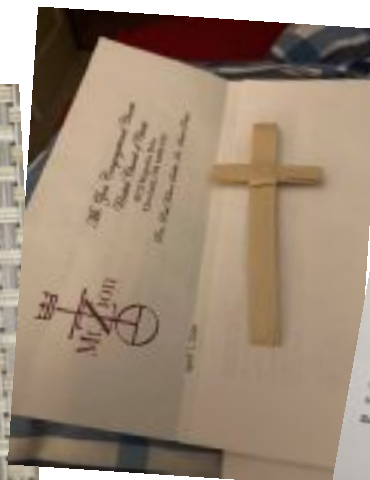
Romans 15:13 assures Christians that "faith is

The Mt. Zion church family congratulates its former member, Barbara Baylor, on her new appointment on the national staff. Baylor was a devoted member. She retired and moved to Atlanta, Georgia to be with her children and grandchildren. Below is the article from the UCC News found at ucc.org.

“The Humanitarian and Development Team of the Cleveland, Ohio-based United Church of Christ wants to ensure that its membership and beyond get facts and not false information about the coronavirus pandemic. So it brought in a public health professional to act as the UCC “point person” for the church’s COVID-19 response.

Barbara Baylor began work Friday, March 20, as UCC Disaster Ministries' Health Liaison. Her job: to help decipher all of the material available from a plethora of respected sources

and create an online daily brief that simplifies the data and shares the latest information about the virus.

This is Baylor's second time on the UCC national staff. She previously served for 18 years as Justice and Witness Ministries' domestic policy advocate and minister for health care justice in Washington, D.C.

“I am committed to providing wellness information to the public about health and safety concerns affecting their community,” Baylor said. “It is important the public have the best research and science with which to make the best decisions for themselves, their families and their communities.”

Themes explored to date include the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on people of color, on people experiencing homelessness, and on children. COVID-19 and the U.S. healthcare system, recently adopted stimulus packages, strategies for coping with stress, and the



discussion around whether and when to wear a face mask also have been examined.
