have felt at the coming of Christ 2000 years ago. Even today, when we sing that great hymn of the church, by J.M. Neale, we beseech Christ to return and take us unto Himself. This Advent is very special and different for me because it is my last Advent serving as your Senior Pastor. There are many emotions that come with this season: joy and sorrow, anticipation, and expectation as well as a profound sense of unknowing. I can only imagine how Mary felt when God called her to be the mother of our Lord...to bring forth a child who would not only save the world but herself as well.

As I come to this Advent season, there are many memories that flood my soul. I remember our first Christmas Morning Prayer on Christmas day, many years ago at Mt. Zion when I didn't know if anyone would get up on Christmas day to come to a Service of Song and Testimony. I remember how pleasantly surprised I was when the Christmas morning worshippers showed up and shared their testimonies of gratitude to God for the abundant blessings God had showered upon them throughout the year.

I remember when we had three services, two in University Circle and one in Solon that Paul III, (Pauly) called the "souled out church" because we sang Hezekiah Walker's song, "Souled Out" so frequently. I remember our once-a-month Healing Services, on Sunday evenings when Elder Rodney Hubbard would play and sing until the Spirit said it was time for us to begin the work of bringing healing to God's people. I remember when we had one Christmas tree in the narthex that greatly resembled the one from "A Charlie Brown Christmas" and I remember the day when Deacon Martha Bullock called me and told me she had found a 12- foot Christmas tree on sale and asked if I wanted her to purchase it for the church. That "yes" began a great Mt. Zion Christmas tradition of "decking the halls." It has

expanded, thanks to Deacon Ann Gibson, to a total of ten trees throughout the sanctuary and Shinn House.

There are memories of rib burn-offs, Covenant Couples gatherings, Community festivals, Church Picnics in Wade Oval, and Car Shows. There were Christmas Vesper Services, Faith and Finance Breakfasts and Community Meals and Produce Giveaways and Golf Outings. And yes, there were great parties (with a purpose) and protests at City Council on Monday nights, and many, many, many, amazing meals cooked by Deacon Mollieta Dorsey for any reason I could come up with! I will never forget the first rehearsal of the Praise Team that took place in my basement, and how Mike Shinn would sing with us every Sunday to give credibility to this new music and worship style that we were introducing to Mt. Zion.

Now, there are some reading this who may choose to remember the conflicts and challenges we faced over the twenty-two years, but I choose not to give energy to those memories. A long time ago, I learned the importance of letting go of hate and hurt and holding onto love and light. So, since this is my story, I choose to remember and recount it in this way. The last twenty-two years of my ministry has been the greatest part of my journey in God's service. I have learned and grown, and I pray you have too. I have nothing but gratitude, love, and praise to God for our joyful journey together.

My prayer for Mt. Zion is that you will embrace your new Senior Pastor with love and openness, and genuine anticipation of what God is going to do in and through you as you strive together to be the church that the world needs in this place at this time.

sanctuary where they presented red and white roses to Lady Kim along with a beautiful inscribed crystal elephant and ed plaque.




