Mt. Zion continued our long tenured tradition of holding Umoja Karamu: A Ritual of the Black Family on Thanksgiving day. With the pandemic and the need to maintain social distance, it was impossible to hold a live event with as many participants as usual in the sanctuary. So, Mt. Zion's ingenious Umoja Karamu team led by Rev. Paul, conceived the idea of a pre-recorded presentation that would enable participants to record each segment separately, allowing everyone to maintain a safe environment in the sanctuary.

In order to do this, Rev. Paul enlisted Musical Director Darnell Epps, who held numerous individual rehearsals prior to the live Praise Team recording of the music (11 songs) in one sitting. Michelle Rankins, Cultural Arts Ministry, Chairperson, envisioned adding a new and exciting twist to our spoken word component by inviting award winning Louisiana journalist, Jarvis DeBerry to read the Katrina section. He recorded live from City Park in New Orleans. His presentation was riveting and powerful. 
Thanksgiving Dinner Drive-Thru


