A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR AND TEACHER



Growing in a Season of Shift

Grace, Mercy and Peace from our awesome God and from our Lord Jesus Christ!

We come to the beginning of this Holy Week observance in an unprecedented time in our world. All of us are grappling with the reality of the radical changes and the uncertainty in our daily lives because of the coronavirus pandemic. Yet, we stand on the threshold of the observance of the last week of our Lord's life on this earth, prior to his crucifixion and the amazing celebration of his resurrection at Easter. Many are concerned about the reality that we will not be together in our sanctuaries to celebrate Easter this year. But, I want to suggest to you two important Biblical and historical realities about Easter. First, let me share something Dr. Cheryl Lindsay reminded all of us in a recent Instagram post - "the early believers, in the first century celebrated Easter every Sunday...not just once a year. Second, many times during the persecution of the first century Christian church, their Easter celebrations had to be done in secret, for fear of arrest, torture and even death."

It was not until the 4th century that a form of Christianity was legalized. Thus, having private celebrations of Easter is akin to what took place for many years in the church. This Sunday which will be Palm Sunday, we will celebrate communion in our homes via our Online Virtual Worship Service. I am extremely pleased that the number of persons participating in our online worship has increased weekly. I am also grateful for those who have continued their generosity in their tithes and offerings to God. I know God will

supply all of your needs through Christ Jesus.

This Communion Sunday, I am asking everyone to prepare to participate in communion with whatever you have in your house as elements. Potato chips and soda, a slice of bread and some water, a cookie and some juice or bread and wine. It is not the form of the Lord's Supper/ Communion that we celebrate, it is the substance...the remembrance of the sacrifice that our Savior made on the cross. This is our celebration and the center of the communion experience, not a wafer and grape juice. So, as we virtually share the communion experience, I will ask you to consecrate with me, whatever you will use for your communion, as we share it together.

I am also gratified by the way in which Mt. Zion members have embraced the technology during this season. I encourage everyone to recognize that this is a Season of Shift. If you have never used Facebook; this is the time. If you do not use the internet; this is the time to embrace the technology. If you have never participated in a video conference; now is the time for that new experience. God is using technology to maintain the unity of the Body of Christ. Now is the time to claim it and use it for the Glory of God. Most importantly, it is our only way of staying connected, of fellowshipping together and of worshiping together during this sojourn of sheltering in place. Please reach out with any questions or concerns in regard to use of the internet. It is an amazing gift that God has afforded us to use during such a time as this. I encourage you to reach out to me. I will be happy to provide a tutorial on Facebook, Webex.com, or on the use of the internet in general.

Now is the time to humble ourselves, pray, seek God's face and turn from anything that is not pleasing to God. Let us continue to focus our attention on the journey of Jesus during the days before his crucifixion. By doing this, we will be prepared to celebrate with great joy, the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, at Easter.






MT. ZION SPOTLIGHT





For the first time, in 2020 the U.S. Census Bureau will accept responses online.


